The Emmaus Halloween Parade is scheduled for Saturday, October 20, 2018, at 7:30 p.m., with a rain date of Sunday, October 21, at 6:30 p.m. All entrants must be registered for the parade. Registration forms are available on the Borough website and in Town Hall. The deadline for registration is October 10, 2018.

Parade Information: Participants will be notified the week of the parade about assigned divisions and reporting locations. **MAKE SURE EVERYONE IN YOUR GROUP KNOWS WHERE AND WHEN TO REPORT!** Division captains in orange vests will guide you to your assigned location.

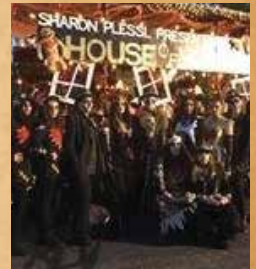
**PRIZES** – Entrants must complete the parade route to be eligible for prizes. Group prizes are awarded to groups of 8 or more. Prize money must be picked up immediately following the parade at the Williams Street ball field located at the intersection of Williams and Ridge Streets.

Rules and Regulations: The following rules and regulations will be strictly enforced.

1. No drilling or exhibition of any type is permitted.
2. No bicycles, skateboards, roller blades, scooters, or motorcycles, unless on a float.
3. No licensed vehicles unless fully decorated in a Halloween theme or pulling a float.
4. No open fires, fireworks, or alcoholic beverages.
5. Throwing or projecting anything, including

- candy, silly string, or coins, will not be tolerated.
6. No business or political advertising.
7. 3 or 4 wheelers are allowed ONLY if pulling a float.
8. A concession permit is required for anyone selling anything along the parade route, including outside sales by stores at fixed locations.

Halloween Parade Committee Meetings are held every Thursday at 7:00 p.m. starting September 13 through October 18, 2018 in the Community Room on the second floor of Town Hall. ### CALLING YOUNG FILMMAKERS FROM MIDDLE SCHOOL TO HIGH SCHOOL!

The Emmaus Arts Commission is proud to continue our Student Film Festival and is pleased to announce this year's competition kickoff is **October 4th** at Emmaus High School cafeteria, 800 Pine Street.

During the kick-off event, high school and middle school filmmakers are provided filmmaking tips and techniques and given a theme and required lines – then, the clock begins and teams have 120 hours to conceptualize, write, shoot, edit and produce a 6-minute (maximum length) film!



Open to any school in the Lehigh Valley and beyond, those who complete the process vie for prizes and ultimately compete to have their films premier on the big screen! All films are due back **October 9th** - students upload their final film to our private YouTube channel. All films are judged on set criteria by an independent panel of professionals in the film industry -- effective use of required material; storytelling ability; quality of acting, editing and film direction; creativity and originality. Entry fee to participate is \$10 per team.

Selected films are screened at the Student Film Festival at Emmaus Theater on Sunday, **October 28th** at 2:00 p.m. followed by an awards ceremony. The public is invited to attend, tickets are \$3 at the door. (PG – Parental Guidance Suggested. Some material may not be suitable for young children.) Winning films are also displayed on the Emmaus Arts Commission website and on our YouTube channel.

Previous Film Festival winners include Parkland High School, Northampton Area High School, Northwestern Lehigh High School, Henry Hudson Regional School, Orefield Middle School, Bethlehem Area Vo-Tech, Lower Macungie Middle School, Salisbury Middle School, Emmaus High School, and North Pocono High School.

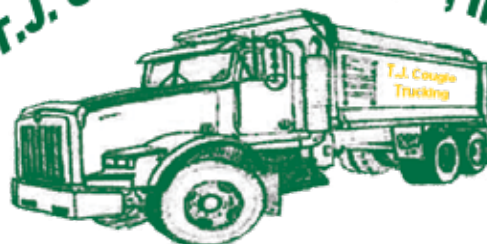

## Curbside Leaf Collection

Barring complications with weather, equipment or emergencies, the Borough of Emmaus will begin its 2018 Curbside Leaf Collection Program on Monday, October 22, 2018, continuing through Friday, December 7, 2018. The Borough is unable to set specific pick-up dates for leaf pick-up for individual streets. We recommend that you have them raked out at the beginning of each week. Once the Public Works Department has made a pass through your street, they will not return until the following week. The Public Works Department will collect 2x a week for 7 weeks during the fall season. Please be advised that if the Borough encounters winter weather and must plow, any leaves in the road will be plowed. Every attempt will be made to clean the roads prior to winter. For FINAL COLLECTION the week of December 2 through December 7, you are advised to have your leaves out on Monday morning (December 3rd) of the final week. Once we have made our final pass on your street, we will not return.



- Please rake all leaves to the curb into long narrow rows not more than 18" into the road. Leaves placed on the sidewalk will not be collected. The Public Works Department will not empty bags or other containers; this is the responsibility of the resident. Branches, shrubbery, grass, garbage, dog waste, and other building materials will not be picked up.
- Leaves will not be collected on private property. If leaves are not in place when the crews go by, they will be picked up on the following round through the Borough. No "return trips" will be made to pick them up.
- Residents who have areas designated as "No Parking" (yellow painted curbs) are encouraged to pile leaves at these locations for easier pick up.
- Piles with anything other than leaves **will not** be picked up. These objects will cause damage to the leaf pickup units and put them out of service at a great expense of time and money to the Borough and its residents.
- Do not place tarps over your leaves. The Public Works Department will bypass them and they will not be collected.
- To help facilitate the picking up of the leaves, please keep all vehicles away from the area where the leaves are piled. The Public Works Department will not rake piles of leaves out from between parked cars or from under them.
- Do not pile leaves on or around storm drains as this will cause flooding issues and create unsafe driving conditions.

**Please do not place leaves out prior to the starting date.** If you would like to remove your leaves prior to the beginning of leaf collection, you may drop your leaves off at the Emmaus Borough Compost Site located off of Klines Lane. ## EARTH DAY 2018 COMMUNITY CLEANUP

The Emmaus and Upper Milford Township Joint Environmental Advisory Council's Earth Day Clean-Up Event and celebration was held on Saturday, April 14, 2018 at the Emmaus Community Park.

The weather was fantastic and the event was a huge success providing environmental awareness for the whole community. The event began with coffee, donuts, bagels, and approximately 122 volunteers participating in the 14th Annual event. Volunteers picked up litter and trash in areas of Emmaus and Upper Milford Township. Cleaning up the litter along approximately 3.5 miles of local roadways, with the following items collected:

- 54 (30 Gallon) Bags of Trash
- 16 (30 Gallon) Bags of Recyclables

In addition, the Earth Day Event also featured an electronics recycling opportunity for community members to safely recycle items like televisions, cell phones, microwaves, computers, air conditioners, and batteries. Items were accepted at Emmaus Community Park from 9:00 a.m. until 11:30 a.m., when the trucks were filled. A total of 23,205 lbs. of recyclables were dropped off (9,463 lbs. more than last year), collected and processed by Responsible Recycling Services, LLC, along with 65 lbs. of alkaline batteries and 35 lbs. of rechargeable batteries. United Documentation Destruction also provided a truck with employees, paid for in part by Representative Justin Simmons, and Senator Patrick Browne, which allowed residents to shred and

recycle 4,693 lbs. of paper documents, plus 2 cubic yards of cardboard that was recycled.

The following organizations provided donations, materials, and/or assistance for the event: The Borough of Emmaus, Upper Milford Township, Lehigh County Authority, Weis Markets, Responsible Recycling Services, LLC, J P Mascaro and Sons, the PA Department of Transportation, the East Penn Press, United Document Destruction, Representative Justin Simmons, and Senator Patrick Browne. ## Emmaus Heritage Alliance

The Emmaus Heritage Alliance and the East Penn School District partnered again this past June for a few days of experiencing local history. The second year of this program, expanded to include third grade classes from Wescosville Elementary School, in addition to third graders from Lincoln and Jefferson Schools. The children were given a brief introduction to local history beforehand, through a story created by local writer Corrine Durdock, and a slide show prepared by Jeanne Harakal of the Emmaus Historical Society.

On the days of the event the children were given color maps guiding them to each of the four historic sites in Emmaus - Shelter House, God's Acre Cemetery, the 1803 House, and the Knauss Homestead. They learned about life in the early years of the settlement, including details of their first log cabins, the food they ate, the herbs they grew and how they used them, the chores they did, and the nature of the cemetery in which they were eventually laid to rest. All activities were oriented toward satisfying the specific curriculum goals of the school district.

The Alliance is also making plans for their 2nd Annual Emmaus Heritage Festival, on Sunday September 23rd from 11:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. The event will take place on the grounds of the Emmaus Historical Society at 218 Main St., and will include inside and outside displays on local history, as well as children's activities, period crafts, demonstrations, entertainment and of course good food.

The Emmaus Heritage Alliance is a forum for historic issues within the Borough. Members include the Emmaus Historical Society, Shelter House Society, Knauss Homestead Preservation Society, Friends of the 1803 House, Emmaus Public Library, Emmaus Moravian Church, Emmaus Remembrance Garden, and the Emmaus Main Street Partners. We look forward to seeing you at the Festival.



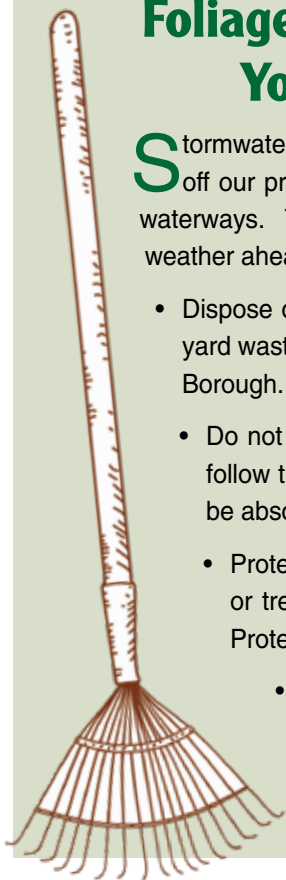

## Foliage & Fertilizer – Tips for Protecting Your Plants, Trees, and Streams

Stormwater is formed when rainwater makes its way into storm drains or runs off our properties directly into streams picking up harmful substances that pollute our waterways. This fall, help the Borough to control stormwater pollution while preparing your lawns for the weather ahead. Below are several tips to help you protect your plants, trees, and streams.

- Dispose of leaf litter and yard waste at the Compost Site and never in the street or stream. Shred yard waste to use as mulch or fertilizer. Utilize the yard waste collection program offered through the Borough.
- Do not use fertilizers immediately before a rainstorm and do not apply them in excess. Always follow the directions on the package for application and disposal. Excess fertilizer cannot be absorbed by the soil and will wash away with the rain.
- Protect young trees on your property by covering trunks with ventilated tree tubes or tree guards. Young trees are particularly vulnerable to grazing and deer rub. Protecting the trunks will improve their chance for survival.
- Prune your summer perennials in your garden. After the first frost cut back dry stems of perennials to soil level. This will extend the life of your plants, improve the health of your garden, and showcase winter perennials.

## HALLOWEEN SAFETY TIPS FROM THE EMMAUS POLICE DEPARTMENT



### TRICK OR TREAT NIGHT Friday, October 26, 2018 • 6:00 P.M. TO 8:00 P.M.

(Rain or Shine)

It's the time of year for costumes, sweets, tricks and treats. While Halloween offers plenty of make-believe fun, it also brings real safety risks, as children dart across dark streets with their minds more on candy than on cars. **Children are twice as likely to be hit by a car on Halloween than on any other night of the year.**

Halloween can be safely enjoyed — especially when parents put extra care into planning and supervision. Talk with your children every year about safety concerns unique to this holiday, and review do's and don'ts before heading out to trick or treat.

Burns and cuts are also common on Halloween. And then there's the candy: Almost two-thirds of parents think their kids eat too much of it around Halloween.

Please follow these tips to keep your family safe this spooky season.

#### Get clever with costumes

From furry animals to princesses and superheroes, choosing costumes wisely is an important part of Halloween safety. Follow these tips:

- **The brighter the better.** Whether you buy a costume or make one yourself, choose bright colors and flame-retardant materials. If your child will be trick or treating outdoors after dark, attach reflective tape to his or her costume or treat bag.
- **Size it right.** In case it's chilly outdoors, make sure your child's costume is loose enough for warm clothing to be worn underneath — but not long enough to cause tripping. Avoid oversized shoes and high heels.
- **Skip the masks.** A mask can obstruct your child's vision, especially if it slips out of place. Use kid-friendly, nontoxic makeup instead.
- **Limit accessories.** Pointed props — such as wands, swords and knives — might pose safety hazards. Carry flashlights or wear glowing wristbands instead.

#### Trick or treat with care

Before your children start trick-or-treating, review these basic Halloween safety rules:

- **Get in on the fun.** Accompany trick or treaters younger than age 12. Pin a piece of paper with your child's name, address and phone number inside your child's pocket in case you get separated. Encourage older kids to trick or treat with a group of friends, parents or older siblings. Make sure someone in the group has a flashlight with fresh batteries.
- **Set ground rules.** If your child will be trick-or-treating without you, plan and discuss a familiar route and set a curfew. Review safety rules, including staying with the group, walking only on the sidewalk, approaching only clearly lit homes, and never going inside a home or car for a treat. Have your child carry a cellphone for the evening so that he or she can contact you.
- **Inspect treats before indulging.** Don't let your child snack while

he or she is trick or treating. Feed your child an early meal before heading out, and inspect the treats before allowing your child to dive in. Discard anything that's not sealed, has torn packaging or looks questionable. If you have young children, weed out gum, peanuts, hard candies and other choking hazards.

If your child has food allergies, check candy labels carefully. Even hard candies may be manufactured in facilities that process nuts, milk, soy, wheat, egg or other allergens.

- **Ration the loot.** If your child collects gobs of goodies, dole out a few pieces at a time and save the rest. You might even ask your child if he or she would like to swap some — or all — of the candy for something else, such as a special toy, book or outing.
- **Plan a party.** Consider planning a trick or treat party with a couple of neighbors instead of house-to-house door knocking. Decorate the garages, have a costume contest, and plan games and prizes. Check local schools, malls and churches to find other safe celebration options.

#### Stay safe and sweet on the home front

Planning to hand out treats? To make sure you're ready for trick or treaters, follow these tips:

- **Clean up.** Put away anything trick or treaters could trip over, such as garden hoses, toys, bikes and lawn decorations. Clear wet leaves, snow or other debris from the sidewalk.
- **Turn the lights on.** Replace any burned-out bulbs to ensure good visibility at the walkway and front door.
- **Control your pets.** Take no chances that your pet might be frightened and chase or bite a child at your door.
- **Consider sugar substitutes.** Instead of handing out sugar-laden treats, try stickers, fun pencils, rubber insects or colored chalk.

If you'll be driving on Halloween, watch for children who might pop out between parked cars. Be especially careful entering or leaving driveways and alleys. Extra caution can help ensure Halloween safety for everyone.

#### Carve safely

Before you start carving pumpkins, consider these Halloween safety rules:

- **Decorate with markers, glitter glue or paint.** Let young children draw faces on pumpkins with art supplies. Leave any carving to an adult.
- **Use candles with care.** Place candlelit pumpkins on a sturdy surface away from curtains and other flammable objects. Never leave candlelit pumpkins unattended. Better yet, light pumpkins with flashlights, battery-operated flameless candles or glow sticks instead.

## THE EMMAUS POLICE DEPARTMENT



### Internet Safety Rules for Teens and "Tweens" from the Emmaus Police Department

Keep computers in the family room and limit kids' home internet time - Make a family rule that keeps laptops out of the bedroom and in the family room. Your child can still enjoy privacy when going online but is less likely to search out or click on questionable content if he or she knows that you could walk by at any moment. Enforcing internet time also helps you maintain authority over your child's internet usage.

Be honest about content redistribution - Sexting apps like Snapchat promise to delete content by a date you request; however, if a user screen shots the content, they own a copy of it. Socially shared images have had disastrous consequences for teens. Use recent news stories (for example the Steubenville or Maryville rape cases) as a teachable moment for your child. Once posted online, content can be dangerous.

Teach your child how to maintain personal privacy - One in five children is sexually solicited online. When your tween's Facebook page shows their full name, picture, hometown, age, gender and school, it becomes easier for pedophiles to locate them. Engage with your child about why it's important to protect personal information online and what is appropriate and inappropriate to post. Setting rules, such as "no meeting up with people you meet online unless accompanied by mom and dad" can help your child understand boundaries.

Use an internet system that offers parental control and personal protection - Older kids may take advantage of home alone time by going online. Help keep them safe by investing in a home internet provider that offers parental protection, firewalls and spamware or malware filters. Call and discuss these different features for home phone and internet deals or for satellite providers before committing.

Teach critical thinking skills - As the National Institute of Health notes, children's brains aren't fully developed until age 25. At younger ages, they may lack judgment and critical thinking skills. Walk children through critical thinking about web content using homework assignments as a starting point. For example, if your child needs to write a book report, help her research, then demonstrate the difference between user-submitted content, authoritative content and spam.

Monitor child internet activity - It is extremely important to monitor what your child is doing online since there is a big gap between what you can see your child doing at home and what happens in their digital worlds'. There are some great products available, like uKnowKids, that can help you understand and engage with your child's digital life and act if necessary.



## News from the Emmaus Shade Tree Commission

### Cherries for Earth Day

An Emmaus business adds five trees to the community streetscape

It should come as no surprise to those who know Andrew Foreman and Marguerite Viola that the community-minded couple would spearhead a tree-planting project to beautify the Emmaus street where they live and work. "I always think, how can we make things prettier?" Viola asks.

Foreman and Viola, the husband-and-wife owners of Switchback Pizza Company, have been serving wood-oven pizzas at the former train depot at 525 Jubilee Street since 2012. This spring, the couple celebrated Earth Day by planting five 'Okame' flowering cherry trees in a strip of bare lawn next to the restaurant. It was a group effort, Viola explains.

"We found a lot of community support, as soon as we said we wanted to plant trees," she says. Customers of Switchback Pizza contributed toward the \$550 cost of the trees; Funk Brewing Company, nearby on South Sixth Street, also participated in a fundraiser for the project. Viola rallied a group of friends and customers to help plant the trees on Earth Day (April 22). About 20 volunteers, including two neighborhood families with small children, pitched in to dig holes, put the trees in place, and water. With so many eager helpers, the work was completed quickly and was rewarded with a lunch of Switchback pizzas.

'Okame' cherries are small ornamental trees that bloom in early spring, before the trees leaf out. They grow in an upright oval shape when young, eventually reaching about 20 or 25 feet in height. The Switchback trees extend an existing block-long row of mature flowering cherries on the railroad side of Jubilee Street, between Fourth and Fifth Streets.

The five trees planted this spring are just the beginning, Viola says. She's already planning another fundraiser to add four more trees in 2019.

To Foreman and Viola, the idea of striving to improve one's community is a no-brainer. Although neither grew



up in the Lehigh Valley, they chose Emmaus as the location to launch their business and to raise their son. "Emmaus is a great town for families," Viola says.

#### Call Before You Cut

Healthy, well-maintained trees add to property values and the quality of our lives. Before planting, pruning, or removing any tree within the public right-of-way (within 12 feet of the curb), Emmaus property owners must request a permit from the Shade Tree Commission. # Thank You from the Emmaus Ambulance Corps



The Staff of the Emmaus Ambulance Corps would like to thank everyone who sent in their 2018 membership subscription. These funds along with medical insurance payments are vital in keeping our 911 ambulance service ready and available to respond to the needs of our community. We have also received several donations from the community this year and we are very thankful for the help we receive from your donations. With a challenging insurance reimbursement system, your subscriptions and donations are more important than ever. In mid-October 2018, we will be mailing out the 2019 ambulance subscription forms. Your subscription can save you up to hundreds of dollars on 911 calls.

The first half of 2018 has been busy for Emmaus Ambulance Corps. Our EMTs and Paramedics have responded to the following runs up through June 30th: 911 EMS calls = 1251. Non-Emergency transports (wheelchair van and stretcher) = 388. Total call volume = 1639. The Emmaus Ambulance Corps runs 2 emergency Paramedic ambulances on day shift during the week to handle the call volume. We also add crews for special event standbys and larger incident types as needed. We take pride in being able to meet the medical transportation needs of the local Emmaus community.

Some examples of permits that the Borough of Emmaus require are: roof repairs, building repairs or remodels (causing structural changes), footers, foundation, framing, plumbing, electrical, signs, fences, sheds, dumpsters, demolition, driveways, pools, and zoning.
